## **Section 2 GENERAL HAZARDS**

HAZARD	RISK	SAFETY MEASURE
Sun	Sun burn	Wear hat, use sun block
Terrain	Fall etc	Have mobile phone. Let someone know where you are and when you will be coming back. Team work on remote sites. Avoid high risk sites such as cliffs, ravines and quarries.
Road	Traffic	Wear florescent jacket. Do not work on busy or fast roads without verge or pavement.
Water Bodies	Drowning	Do not work in deep water/mud or areas of uncertain depth
Water Bodies	Weil's Disease	Treat all fresh water as potentially contaminated. Do not expose fresh cuts or scratches to water. Be aware of the symptoms of Weil's disease and see a doctor immediately if symptoms develop
Ticks	Lymes Disease	Avoid tick bites by wearing long trousers tucked into socks when working in long grass and bracken. Check for ticks regularly. If bitten be aware of symptoms and see a doctor if they develop.
